DTL Seminary Bookshelf (Provided by the Digital Theological Library)

As Denver Seminary alumni, you can get discounted access to the Digital Theological Library's (DTL) Seminary Bookshelf. The library has a very strong emphasis on biblical studies, theology, church history, and practical theology. The library adds hundreds of new titles monthly. Nearly all of the books are downloadable. The books are chosen by seminary professors and curated by professional librarians.

The Seminary Bookshelf now contains:

- Over 1,300,000 eBooks,
- Over 850,000 eBooks from the last 25 years,
- Over 400,000 eBooks from the last 10 years, and
- Over 125,000 eBooks from the last 5 years.

Base price for individual member access is \$10 a month.

Alumni Discounts

Denver Seminary Alumni are eligible for one of two discount options:

- A free trial for three months (use code: dtlalum25)
- A 25% discount with an annual membership (use code: callmerev23)

Note: The Free Trial is a one-time offer with no additional discount. After 3 months, the member is charged the normal \$10 monthly fee. The 25% is renewable for as long as the person remains a member of the library.

AtlaSerials (Provided by Denver Seminary)

AtlaSerials (Atlas) is an online full-text collection of major religion and theology journals used by libraries, librarians, scholars, students, and religious leaders.

- **Total Number of Records:** More than 730,000 records, 370+ journal titles
- **Type of Records:** Electronic collection of journals plus bibliographic citations, featuring PDFs, with searchable texts of articles and reviews
- **Coverage Areas:** Bible, archaeology, and antiquities; human culture and society; church history, mission, and ecumenism; pastoral ministry; world religions and religious studies; theology, philosophy, and ethics.

ProQuest Religion Database (Provided by the Digital Theological Library)

ProQuest Religion provides access to 250 scholarly journals, with most titles available in full text.

- **Type of Records:** Electronic collection of journals plus bibliographic citations, featuring PDFs, with searchable texts of articles and reviews
- **Coverage Areas:** formal theological studies and commentary on topics of general interest from the perspectives of many, worldwide religions. In addition, there are many titles from religious publishing bodies and nondenominational organizations. Includes coverage of religious news and information, informative details on doctrines and philosophies, and scholarly reports on religious history. Journal coverage includes related religious studies, such as philosophy, ethics, and international perspectives.

OADTL (Provided by the Digital Theological Library)

The mission of Open Access Digital Theological Library (OADTL) is to curate high-quality content in religious studies and related disciplines from publisher websites, institutional repositories, scholarly societies, archives, and stable public domain collections. The OADTL uses the world’s most advanced integrated library system (ILS) for cataloging and discovery. This system, OCLC’s WorldShare, makes content easily discoverable and retrievable. The OADTL is staffed by professional librarians and curates content without regard for theological or confessional perspective. It is hoped that the increased access to high-quality religious studies content will serve scholars and students of religion.

The Carey S. Thomas Library is part of the Paul and Marjorie Lewan Learning Resource Center, which is building 300 at the north end of campus. The Vernon C.
